Ray Newby Recalls Days With Butcher

The late Roy Butcher, civic leader and electrical contractor, was an oldtime ship radio operator, as were Ray Newby now a marine specialist in Stockton, and George S. Hubbard, retired.

George wrote Ray about Roy's death, and Ray replied in reminiscent fashion.

"Sure I knew him," Ray wrote. "We were partners in a lot of wordly things. I met Roy on the small fishing tender 'Kvichak' on which we went to Nak Nek, Alaska for the Alaska Packers."

Ray recalled that later he took Roy under his wing when the latter was in poor health and had him at the Newby home at 1065 Bird Ave.

"Later, we became partners, wiring old homes all over the Santa Clara Valley for juice," Ray said. "We didn't ride a bicycle but rather used my tandem motorcycle.

"Roy and I later purchased the Lyric Theater across from the Jose on Second street. I ran the cameras and Roy commuted to S.F. every day on the S.P. to get film exchanges.

"I introduced Roy to Ruth Monier, a neighbor of mine who was ticket seller. I still remember working two projected in a small room designed for one, for 11 hours a day and spending the rest of the day or night repairing the nickelodeon groan-box.

"To make a long story short, I went back to sea, Roy married Ruth, took over the wiring company we organized and later Butcher became about the biggest electrical contractor in Santa Clara County. He made it big doing the electrical contracting for Camp Roberts in World War II." of the life
