Whereas, I, Carl Kinsley, a citizen of the United States, residing in the City, County and State of New York, have invented a certain new and useful improvement in apparatus and circuits for automatically receiving wireless telegraph signals for which I have this day executed an application for letters patent of the United States, and

Whereas, I am also about to file applications for letters patent thereon in divers foreign countries, to wit, England, France, Germany and others, and

Whereas, being about to leave the United States for a lengthy voyage, during the progress of which I will be out of communication with my friends in this country, and there being divers other persons who wish to acquire an interest in said invention and in all the letters patent, domestic and foreign, which may be granted thereon, and

Whereas, a certain proposition has been made to me by the said persons whereby they may acquire an undivided half interest in the invention and the patents which said proposition I have accepted, and

Whereas, finally, William Wirt Kinsley, of Falls Church, Virginia, standing as the representative of the parties in interest, is desirous of acquiring the legal right to this invention and to the patents thereon, subject however to the directions and limitations contained in a certain letter of this date addressed to him, said letter fully identifying this instrument, and forming part hereof in its provisions; now therefore
