

The War Incidents

An extract from Wireless Age April 1915

Operators M.W. Grinnell and A.E. Ericson, of the American Marconi Company, who were detailed on the *City of Macon* when she steamed from this country recently, bound for Bremen, Germany, underwent an eventful experience, having been arrested as suspected spies and imprisoned. When the steamship arrived near the mouth of the River Weser the wireless men took several photographs, among the objects which they snapped being a torpedo boat destroyer and a floating mine. While the *Macon* was steaming up the River Weser they also photographed an aeroplane which was soaring above the vessel.

They were considerably surprised a short time afterward when the vessel was boarded by German officers and they were placed under arrest. The explanations not being satisfactory, their camera and photographs were confiscated and they were taken from the vessel and locked up. It was not until several days later, after their stories had been thoroughly investigated, that they were released.
