PIONEERS

By The Ancient Mariner

Members of the Society may wonder how their organization came into existence. You may wonder ... who we're the individuals who really started the Society and just how and why did it happen ?

The scenario of our founding is perhaps quite simple and logical in nature. The 'founder' of the Society, William A. "Bill" Breniman (thats me) I will use the first-person singular from no on in my narative which I will try to condense, although I think a bit of background furnishes motivation and cause.)

My ties with communications have been strong through all of my life. At the early age of 12 my cousin Gene and I talked to each other via morse code over wires from the house to the bunk-house on on the 'ranch' in Wyoming. Later, I bought one of Duck's Long Wave Couplers and built a receiving station in my Colorado home.

Later I joined the Navy and because I knew the code I was detailed to signal school to learn "International" morse. I also became proficient in wig-wag, blinker and semaphore as well as both codes.

During WW-1 I served on two ships and was paid off at NAT, New Orleans which is really across the river at a place called Algiers. My commercial career included many years operating (all types of ships) I spent time as an entrepreneur in the radio retail and whole sale business. I also owned radio school and was the Southern Calif. Supvr. for SORS. A chap by the name of Jay Peters and | started a 'first of its kind' ... "On Location Radio Service" to permit movie studios to contact sets on location. Due to heavy commitments in other phases, I sold my interest to "Jay". He later sold the equipment to start broadcast stations in Albuquerque, NM and Reno, Nevada. From business back to operating and as MRI for RCA I went into the Federal Airways when they were expanding their system and flying was becoming popular. I had nearly 30 years of tenure in the Civil Aeronautics Administration when I retired in 1958. During this time, fate was kind to me and I not only enjoyed the work of 'building the airways' but I had many credits for pioneering new ideas and seeing ideas adopted. The Airways drew some of the best talent (Operators, Engineers, etc) in the country as the pay was rewarding and the challenges great. My most rewarding experience was in meeting thousands of employees and peers many of whom I still contact although the sheer imput of mail that needs attention now inhibits my ability to reply - a distinct negative situation.

Upon retirement, I thought as a hobby or avocation, I should do something to benefit humanity and my fellow workers, hence I decided to try and record the history of the Airways, especially early day communications. I also thought we should form an organ iazation to bind our group together, hence I founded the SOCIETY OF AIRWAY PIONEERS back in 1958. I continued as Executive Secretary of this organization of about 3000 members until approximately July 1971 when I turned the gavel and reins over to Mr. Nelson F. Barritt for reason which will become clear in the following paragraphs.

My wife Ruth and I moved to Santa Rosa, Calif., in 1964 from Santa Barbara to which we retired after leaving CAA (Now FAA).

We had visited the area several times and two good friends in particular (Marge and Jerry Whittaker) and (Frieda and Earl Wohler) "sold' us on moving here. We have no regrets after 18 years of making the move except population growth is pushing us out !

We started looking up old shipmate friends that I had worked with or known during my sea-going days. It did not take long until we had made contact with several dozen of the old-timers. As time



went by, the Brenimans had 'open house' to our old friends between Christmas and New Years. By 1966 the number became so large that we suggested a 'get-to-gether' at one of our popular dining institutions - The Green Mill at close-by Cotati. Meanwhile I had broached the idea of forming a small organization of the old-timers in the area which seemed to 'click'. So it was that in early Feb. 1968 a group of about 45 got together for a reunion and it was here that I proposed the organization which at that time I had named . "THE AMERICAN SOCIETY OF WIRELESS PIONEERS OF THE SEVEN SEAS" (Quite a mouth full !). Richard Johnstone - former Chief Operator for RCA (SF) Frank Geisel recently retired Chief of KPH, Eb Cady, retired Chief KFS and those attending thought it was a great idea so a new organization was born. At the time, I was acting as M/C so nominated the 'dean' of those attending _"RJ" as first "Prexy" Other offices filled included that of Executive Director (yours truly); Vice President Membership - Frank Geisel; Trea surer - "Jerry" Whittaker; Secretary - Eb Cady.

By late June (1968) nearly 150 had joined the new Society. We decided to change our name as being too unwieldy to that of "THE SOCIETY OF WIRELESS PIONEERS, Inc.which remains our current name. At the end of the first year 290 members had joined the Society. It is worthy to note that the end of the next year - 1969 we recorded Member No. 500. His name was Col. Allen Barnabei. Since then the Society has grown to be the largest professional radio-telegraph communications society in the world with about 4250 members - worldwide. Our "objective and purpose" has changed from that of a fraternal organization to that of collecting, researching and recording the history of communications -- perticularly that which relates to Hertzian waves and the wireless or radio-telegraph mode of the art.

On a personal note I feel that I should mention the "One Horse Shay" which fell apart just one hundred years and a day after it was built. Ye Ed has 18 years to go before reaching that magical number, however while enjoying good health, the slowing process is noticable to me if not others. My eyes, ears and fingers lack the vitality of bygone years hence it is prudent that others take over the direction of the organization. I will remain as long as I am able to help (perhaps edit a few publications plus furnish material) and in an advisory basis with offer to assist within the limit/s of my capacity and health. I have personally mandated the completion of several projects including the "Almanac", Aviation issue of Sparks Journal, SPARKS IV to name a few. The Board of Governors will receive my request for relief shortly. Action may not be immediate as I will assist though a transition, as necessary. One of our good members with considerable experience in journalism is giving consider ation in volunteering for the assignment.


PAST DIRECTORS OF "GOLDEN GATE" CHAPTER HONORED

This will allow chapters to respond without delay and perhaps on a more personal basis. Also try to insure the authenticity of all such reports to guard against embarrassment to yourself and the Society.




To the families of the recent 'Silent Keys', Officers and members express their sympathies. A moment of silence will be observed on all nets in memory of deceased members.

ALASKA PACKERS SOLD.

Many of our members will recall the nostalgic edition we ran on the Windjammers and other ships that engaged in fishing the waters of Alaska. This special issue titled " Bristol Bay Edition was published last year and featured The Great 'Star Fleet' of the Alaska Packers.

The Alaska Packers Association was one of the oldest seafaring names in the maritime history of San Francisco and among the last to use History must record that this company which was sailing ships. founded in 1893 was put of for sale by Del Monte Corpn. present owners at it no longer fits their product mix. In later years (1916) it was among several companies that mergetd to form the California Packing Copr. that used the Del Monte brand Name. Many will recall the labels - Arctic Red, Horseshoe, Cape Kariuk, Chief Canoe, Lilly, Seward, etc.

This unit was put up for sale late last year. Del Monte was acquired by R.J. Reynolds Industries in 1979. During the heyday of the Packers, a sailing ship would return from Alaska with 80,000 cases of tinned salmon in its hold.

SKIPPER'S LOG 81-5 vs MURPHY'S LAWS.

Several members with sharp eyes caught the error in the Log's Masthead in this last issue. The word PIONEERS was sans its required "R" so it came out PIONEES'. We do not recall ever seeing a picture of the actual installation on the Titanic although we have run pictures of 'duplicate" installations (one said identical) on other ships of the same era, perhaps the Carpathia if memory serves. Back to Square One ... If any member can furnish a picture of the original TITANIC installation we would appreciate it very much.



While on the subect of the TITANIC we wish to correct a misconception in the minds of some of our members that text on Page

30 of the "Titanic Edition" (Vol. 4 No. 4) might have given. The text reads ..." This was the first use of the SOS signal used at sea "

Our good member Louise Ramsey Moreau, W3WRE (TA-25) points out the statement per se is incorrect as Operator Theodore Haubner on the SS arapahoe, Aug. 11 1909 sent SOS as the ship was dangerously near Diamond Shoals as she broke her shaft 21 miles SE of Cape Hatteras and a strong NE gale was driving the helpless ship toward the dreaded "graveyard of ships". This is first recorded instance of an American ship sending the SOS call. Parenthetically it might be added that Operator Haubner also "CQD" (for insurance that he was heard and understood). Bibliographic reference is "SOS to the RES-CUE" published by member Karl Baarslag - 175-SGP back in 1935.

It might be noted that SOS was officially adopted by international ratification in 1908, but the older "CQD" lingered on for several years, especially in the British service where it had originated. It was not until/smashed into the ice-berg that fateful night of April 1912 that Jack Phillips sent "SOS" after sending "CQD" ... just to make sure and as a suggestion of Second Operator Harold Bride and Captain E.J. Smith. (*The Titanic)

"Lou" Moreau makes the point that ..." Too many of our legends, and too much of our tradition (telegraph as well as radio) are clouded with a lot of incorrect material, mainly because of very simple and at times, unconscious errors that seem to hang on rather than true facts." We wouldn't agree more and thanks for calling this to our attention. Actually we published this correct version in the SOS/ CQD Chronology some time back.

We think that Author d'Onofrio meant that it was the first time that a large ocean liner on the Trans-Atlantic run had ever used the SOS signal due to their inborn preference to CQD - originated by the British verses SOS suggested by the Germans. It is recorded that the Americans recommended "CQ" which was not adopted. It took the Titanic Tragedy to bring all interests together in the use of a common signal.

The third man from the left in the front row (with sword) is Chief Radio Electrician LUKE W. DUFRESNE with whom he served aboard the USS New Orleans. Hopes someone will identify the others. COSTS ARE UP. The following article clipped from a recent Association Journal is indicative of how some of our costs are still on the rise although it is reported the rate has slowed some.

Non-Profit Assns Whacked by Big Postage Increase, Up 2¢ Each

The long-feared postage hike for non-profit organizations finally happened last week, as the US Postal Service raised publication and bulk mail rates for preferred mailers about 2¢ per piece across the board. This virtually doubled the presorted carrier route price, to 4¢ per piece, and pushed all non-profit prices to the "Year 16" level on the phasing schedule.

Congress, by its 3rd continuing resolution, cut USPS public service funding to \$230-Million, \$414-Million less than the amount set in the Postal Reorganization Act and the USPS budget request. Funding for the "revenue foregone" subsidy was cut from the requested \$799-Million to \$639-Million, triggering, the non-profit organization postage increases.

It might be of interest to note as we did - the value of the dollar as it compared to 1968 when the Society was founded. According to an article in a recent Washington D. C. publication - "Association Trends" ... the dollar is now worth only 34.8¢ vs. 1968. It is food for thought.


CAULKING COMPOUND

REPORT FROM NORFOLK ISLAND

... and just 'where' is Norfolk Island? you might ask. Well its off the toe of the New Zealand boot (almost a straight line - about 500 miles up the Tasman Sea and very roughly 1200 miles east of Brisbane Australia. Now you know where it is what abaut it? Well, historically, Captain James Cook discovered Norfolk Island in 1774. "It is an Island Paradise", he wrote. It is recorded that in later years the funloving descendants of the Bounty Mutineers arrived on the island from Pitcairn. Since Gerald A. (Jerry)/lives in Santa Rosa, I called and ask him if he was at KOV at the time mentioned. Jerry replied that he was not only at the station but he had assisted 'Bob' Palmer build the 1/2 KW Xmtr (tube) and installed it at Port Herbert, which he also operated that year. Jerry said even at low power, the 340 cycle note carried well on output of 50 watts. Jerry said the "Big Day" at the cannery was July 4th at Port Alexander. Everyone took time off and collected at 'Alexander' on quite a 'spree'.

Larry left the Pac. Coast SS Lines to go with WAMCATS circa 1930. which later became the Alaska Communication System. From Ketchican they had schedules and cleared cannery stations in S.E. Alaska. Other schedules maintained were with WXY-Nome, WXC-Sitka and many others. It is interesting to find out years later that one catches up with history and can turn memories into reality.

If disaster comes-

here's one way LLNL plans to communicate

"We have a confirmed 'Broken Arrow' emergency, Livermore. Helicopter crash and plutonium scatter verified. Over."

"Roger, Nevada. We read you five by five. Over."

The staccato words fill this tiny trailer, which sits at the end of a dirt road near LLNL's northeast corner. The adjacent 100-ft tower is topped by a huge rotating, spider-like highfrequency antenna, arms spread dangling over the earth like the balancing poles of a tightrope walker. The occasion? The joint DOE-DOD Nuclear Weapon Accident Exercise (NUWAX '81) that took place April 21st to 27th. Fortunately, this time, a simulation.

Amid a flurry of activity, Paul Dane, EE's communications engineer who put the emergency radio system facility together, explained, "We're using this communications link to find out what equipment our Emergency Response people in Nevada need during the week-long Exercise. Such things as additional protective clothing, extra portable radio gear...."

Said Dane, "Our operator at that end is Tom Crabtree, a Field Test Systems Division electronics technician assigned to Hazards Control. Besides the Exercise messages we exchange, we're also able to telephone-patch our people down there through to offices here at the Lab or to their families.

At Livermore, besides Dane, the system was being operated alternately by senior technologists Clarence "Pete" Davis, Frank Pacheco and Bruce Somerhalder, technologists Steve Johnson, Edward Valenzuela and Michael Zimmerman, and technicians John Flatley and Martin Loomis, Electronic Services Division's Security and Telecommunications group.

Observing the LLNL-based team in action, EN noted a gamut of skills, attributes and emotions. Efficiency. Cooperation. Sense of humor. Intense concentration. Tension. Even empathy for a few lonely callers from Nevada whose phone patches found no answer at home.

Lessons learned? If a disaster such as the NUWAX simulation should occur, a vital and proven communications link is ready and waiting, along with well-trained and competent people in EE who make it work. NUWAX '81 has "paved" the way. — Donna Lee Paquette

TO ALL CHOPS. We want to take this opportunity to thank all of you who have written in and given us your comments on the Net Bulletin. We are most grateful for your inputs and your support.

NET CHANGES. All CHOPs are requested to notify the Editor of this Bulletin promptly when changes are made to your nets. This includes the addition of new nets or the deletion of old ones. We want to assure that the net schedules published are correct and current but we can only do this with your help.

WHAT DO YOU WANT? What would you like to see in these Net Bulletins? Are you satisfied wit the content of the last three editions? We do need inputs so don't be bashful.

AREA ROSTERS. CHOPs might want to consider making a roster of all licensed amateur members residing within propagation distance of their respective nets. An invitation to those who are not already net members might very well increase net membership. There may be a number of society members who do not belong to the local chapter but who would enjoy the comaraderie found in the SOWP nets. An ideal way to contact these individuals is by the use of an amateur radiogram. Be sure to give the day(s), time(s) and frequencies used by your net(s). It has also been found helpful to publicize the fact that SOWP nets are primarily fraternal nets and not traffic nets.

SOLID COPY AWARD. With the influx of new members into SOWP, it is a good idea to periodically announce over the nets that the Solid Copy Award exists and the requirements for obtaining the Certificate.

AUSTRALIAN TIME STATION. For those who may have occassion to correspond with the Australian Time Station, VNG, their mailing address is: VNG Reference Measurements Section, Telecom Australia Research Laboratories, Box 249, Clayton, Victoria, 3168, Australia.

NEW SHORT WAVE STATION: Radio France International is planning a French Guiana relay station which is scheduled to be operational in 1984.

NEW RFI SOURCE. A new RFI source is beginning to create problems for amateurs. The new device is the CMH a multiplexer, that provides eight multiplexed voice channels over a conventional phone line. The problem is in the switching type power supply, which operates at 79 khz and generates harmonics well into the VHF region. These harmonics are radiated through the phone lines used.

COLLINS KWM-2: The Collins KWM-2 transceiver, normally tunes down to 3400 khz. This range can be expanded by use of a crystal type CR-18/ U with a frequency of 6355 khz. The extended coverage will be from 3400 khz down to 3295 khz. No attempt should be made to go below this limit.

WARNING: Hand held transceivers, using rechargeable nicad batteries, can explode if a conductive object shorts the charging contacts on the case. This can occur when hand helds are carried in pockets. Here, pens, coins or even pencil lead can short the charging contacts. When using a hand-held with a rechargeable pack, exercise care to insure that loose metallic objects are kept clear of the charging contacts. A piece of vinyl tape over exposed contacts will reduce the possibility of shorting the battery. <u>CW RECORDS</u>: On August 5, 1933, Jean Hudson, W3BAK, copied 20 wpm for 5 minutes making perfect copy on the mill. For this performance, she won the World's Championship in Class E at the Chicago World's Fair. If this sounds trivial, consider that Jean had just turned nine years old.

NEW PREFIX. The VP1 prefix is now history. As Belize is now an independent nation, they have a new prefix, namely V3A. Belize as most of you know was formerly British Honduras.

JAPANESE QSL CARDS. When routing your QSL cards via a Japanese QSL manager, please be aware that the dimensions of most Japanese cards are larger than our own and require an envelope at least 4 x 6 inches or larger. This is larger than the standard U.S. envelope.

SPRING FOR A HAND KEY. If you lose the spring from your J-38 hand key, a simple quick replacement can be found in most FT-243 or CR-1 crystal holders.

SECONDARY STATION LICENSES. Until now, the FCC has not allowed amateurs to recover secondary calls after expiration. However, a recent ruling has given a one year grace period wherein amateurs can convert their secondary station calls to their primary station licenses. Although the FCC does not now renew secondary calls, they will transfer the secondary call to the licensee for use on his primary license provided that the application is made within one year after the secondary license has expired. The new order went into effect on 20 April 1982.

JAGUAR-VVHF: The Jaguar-VVHF, a frequency hopping military tactical radio system was recently introduced. The new unit is able to switch from one frequency to another at randomly sequenced periods of up to thousands of times a minute. Frequency hopping avoids the main problems of being located, monitored and jammed.



SOWP 1982 QSO PARTY: In 1976, SOWP held its first QSO Party. Some 182 members took part. The number of participants however has subsequently dwindled year by year. This year, 1982,only four - repeat four - members cared enough to submit logs. The logs submitted showed a total of only 21 different stations involved in the party. It is interesting to note that all four logs were from the 4th call area and the four members submitting them were all members of the Southeastern Net. LATIN AMERICAN CONTACTS: If you would like to make Latin American contacts, you might try the Intra-America Net. This net meets daily on 21,390 khz at 1800 hours GMT.

SPECIAL ACHIEVEMENT AWARD: The U.S. Army Headquarters Europe Club Station, DAIUS, is offering a Special Achievement Award for making contact with DAIUS on five bands. The station is located at Patton Barracks in Heidelberg, West Germany.

GOVERNMENT FREQUENCIES: Computer printouts of Tistings of government frequencies have previously been available through the Freedom of Information Act (FOIA). In a recent decision, the National Telecommunications and Information Agency (NTIA) has decided that such information can no longer be made available to the public.

SPECIAL CALL SIGNS. Do you like to work unusual call signs? If so, you might try NN3SI. This call was assigned to the station set up at the Smithsonian Institution in Washington, D.C. The station demonstrates to visitors the various amateur act ivities. It should be pointed out that visitors with amateur licenses are sometimes allowed to operate the station. At this writing, they have a regular schedule on Tuesdays at 1900 hours UTC on 28.640 mhz.

In the May 1982 issue of the Inland Seas Beacon (publication of the SOWP Inland Seas Chapter), the Stevensons wrote a most interesting description of their travels.

Because of limited space, we've had to take editorial license and do a little cutting. However, we have left the write-up in the author's original words. Many of you have served or visited most of the places mentioned. The article should therefore bring back many memories.

"BE IT EVER SO HUMBLE, THERE'S NO PLACE LIKE A SUITCASE"



At our first stop in Hawaii, we spent our short stay touring and shopping in Honolulu, and visiting the Hale Koa military recreation center at Waikiki Beach. The stop at Pago Pago was also quite short, but we were interested to see the place, since many years ago Steve was offered a job in charge of the radio communications setup there.

From the Australian mainland, we took an immediate connecting flight to New Zealand, arriving at Christchurch in fairly good shape, despite a pretty bumpy landing that seemed to get us down on best two out of three. Later we learned that Christchurch, and most other airports in New Zealand, experience constant turbulance from the air currents swirling across the straits from Australia. New Zealanders seem to bear the Aussies no grudge on this account, however, but instead seem pleased that their local airline pilots tend to become super-expert at the very tricky maneuver of setting em down in one piece. We came to the conclusion that those pilots develop their superior landing skills because they get to do it so often -- at least three times on every hop.

We toured the North and South Islands for three weeks, by plane, train, bus and boat. We crossed to the North Island by ocean-going ferry in a heavy storm -- a bit like a 3½-hour airport landing with waves. We visited Rotorua and the other Hot Springs sections, and the glowworm caves, then returned to the South Island by plane, giving the pilot two chances to demonstrate his landing prowess, with a stop at Wellington en route to Ch'church.


In the South, we took a circle tour, to the west coastal mountains and the glaciers, south along the coast, then back up to Christchurch--to get warm again. The southern ports are departure and supply points for most of the world's Antarctic ventures, and the Ch'church museum has the world's most comprehensive collection of Antarctic exploration artifacts and displays. Included in these are some pretty ingenious and cumbersome communications gear, dating back to those good old days before transistors. Some of the gear weighted more than the operator -- and seemed to get a great deal more care.

Our first serious attack of culture shock hit shortly after our arrival in New Zealand on a weekend, and finding that <u>nothing</u> was open from noon on Saturday until Monday morning. We spent the weekend walking around the city, leaving nose-prints on grocery store windows and looking for an open restaurant to get a meal.

Our Australian tour strategy was to cross to the west coast first, then tour our way back east. While we waited for our bookings, we did all the tourist things we could cram into a couple of days. We toured zany Sydney Opera House, that full-rigged vessel of culture that hovers on the surface of Sydney harbor just below the bridge, its white-tiled sails full to the breeze, threatening to take off at the first stiff wind. We skimmed across the bay on a hydrofoil, then chugged around the shoreline on a slow harbor cruise boat to ogle the rich-folks' mansions. There were hundreds of them, stacked one atop another up the steep slopes that surround the harbor, each clinging desperately to its tiny plot of land above the bay, so its occupants can enjoy this expensive view. Some of these lots, without house, were priced a half a million dollars or more, according to our guide.

Soon it was Westward, ho! by way of all the capital cities: Canberra (the federal capital), Melbourne (Victoria), and Adelaide (South Australia), then across the open land to Perth, the farthest city west, and the capital of Western Australia.

We traveled by bus, because it was spring, the best time to see the Outback. The road from Adelaide to Perth, a 36-hour, 75 mph express bus trip, is definitely the Outback. The cross-country route passes through bushland and timbered areas where kangaroos a-bound (sorry about that), and we certainly saw lots of them.



The lovable koalas may take over your heart, but the kangaroos believe they own the road. Fortunately, they are mostly nocturnal in their natural state, so travelers have a pretty fair shot at the roads by day. But after dark, it's 'Roos rules. Like most creatures, they enjoy the warmth of the asphalt road, and they'll stand their ground against anything on wheels.

The bushland scenery rolled by, the panorama changed to dry scrubland, and we were in Kalgoorlie, the heart of the historic Goldfields. Soon we would drive through the inland wheat growing area and down off the plateau to the coastal plain -- and Perth.

Our visit to Perth was the sentimental journey for us, and we approached it with the essential good humor. Perth is the city where we met, and married, during World War II. Perth has changed, as have we, but the city is still as beautiful as ever, and the people as friendly. We did feel, though, that they could have taken better care of the places that were important to us. The little building that housed the Australian Air Force Communications Unit where Phyl stood radio watches is now a skyscraper (by Perth standards) with a revolving restaurant atop its 32 floors.

The building nearby where Steve was a communications and coding officer at the U.S. Navy's communications center has been demolished in favor of a multi-story parking garage. The home where we later lived, overlooking spectacular Peppermint Grove, the bay from which the PBY flying boats flew their patrols, is now a luxury condominium site. Ah, progress.

We spent a month touring in a rented car, visiting old friends and relatives (well, some of them were old and some were new), and sightseeing. We drove down the coast, then inland to see the wildflowers at their peak. We crossed to the Stirling Range National Park and the Porongorups, and drove through the tall timbers of giant jarrah and karri trees.

From Western Australia, we flew directly to the "Red Center" and Alice Springs. That Australian center sure is red, and by far its most famous feature is Ayers Rock, the largest single rock in the world. Our genial pilot circled the monolith in a figure-eight pattern so passengers on both sides of the craft could see the rock from all sides and take aerial pictures. It was an awesome and eerie sight -- an immense red lump, surrounded by nothing but miles of more redness.

At Alice Springs, we began using our three weeks SuperAussie bus passes, which we had bought before we entered the country. We set out on our first bus tour to Palm Valley, a chasm filled with unique palms in the middle of a vast dry gulch. When we came to a roac marked "Danger! Restricted to 4-wheel drive vehicles only", the driver matter-of-factly pulled over at a wide spot in the road and calmly attached a pair of metal plates to the front wheels of the bus, and we were in 4-wheel mode, in a full-sized Greyhound bus! On the way in, the bus grunted and growled over treacherous rock-banks and huge boulders, up and down incredible inclines, and through sand deeper than the wheel hubs. On the way out, some of the nonbelievers panted and stumbled over the terrain to snap pictures of the bus negotiating those climbs, descents, and turns that looked simply impossible. We've looked at those pictures and slides since we arrived home, and we've come to the conclusion that it really didn't happen.

Among other forays out of Alice Springs, we traveled to nearby Ayers Rock, some 450 miles one way, where we spent a couple of days seeing the Olgas and other sights and the ROCK.

Now, there are rocks, and there are rocks, and Ayers is one of the later. The biggest rock in the world is 1147 feet high and $5\frac{1}{2}$ miles around, and it looks it from any angle. For the intrepid, there is the Climb, a steep path--sometimes as steep as 45° to the top of Ayers Rock, aided by a stout chain that is anchored to the rock face by heavy steel posts. For the trepid, on the other hand, the first 60 yards or so of the path have no chain, so that only the able and the idiots manage to scramble up the steep surface to make the chain-assisted ascent.

We didn't bother to figure out which one of those categories included us, but we both did climb the rock. That friendly and comforting chain goes only about a fourth of the way up, and you don't find that out until you come to the end of it. The rest of the climb is marked by little streaks of white.

The ascent took us about an hour and a half, and we spent a lot of that time just sitting against the slope and supervising the world while our motors cooled down. Several times we watched a pair of large birds circling the ascent side of the rock. Some other climbers told us they were giant hawks, but we figgured we knew a buzzard when we saw one.

When we finally did reach the top, we found that somebody had taken the sign-in book, but we took pictures of the view all around and of ourselves, to remind us of what we had done.

From Alice Springs we traveled south on the main highway to Adelaide, and it includes some 750 miles of corrugated, red dirt road. The bus shuddered and shook as if it could never survive another mile of such pounding. But survive it did, and we tossed and rattled our way south, through Woomera, and through the opal-mining town of Coober Pedy. We couldn't resist a stop to buy some of those pretty rocks and to tour underground "buildings in which much of the population lives and works. One was a tiny church, complete with altar, and chairs for the congregation.

Adelaide is a picturesque city, surrounded by farmland and some of Australia's best vineyards. We passed up the Great Grapes tour, taking instead several other tours to other places of interest.

From Adelaide, we crossed to Melbourne, where Phyl had served as W/T Op at VNHQ, before being transferred to Perth. Among the Melbourne tours was a trip to Philip Island to watch the emerging of the fairy penguins from the ocean. The tiny creatures most of them no bigger than 12 or 13 inches long -spend their days in the ocean swallowing what fish they can find, then at dusk they come ashore to feed their squawking young. Each bird waddles unerringly to its own nest, even though there are thousands of them crowded into the shrubbery, sand dunes and rock faces along the shore.

The birds are strictly protected, and spectators are restricted to roped-off areas during the "penguin parade." There are stiff fines for making noise, or snapping a forbidden camera flash, or even for not stepping out of the way should a penguin choose to walk where a person is standing -- much less attempting to touch one of the birds as it walks fearlessly by. Regrettably, the protection laws are not so well understood by the penguins' other fellow travelers on this planet. Fairy penguins happen to be a favorite food of the sea-lions that hang around the bay, their McDonald's -by-the-sea.


In and out of Canberra, there were more city tours and country sightseeing trips. We visited the Snowy Mountains and Mt. Kosciusco, Australia's tallest mountain, and while we thought traveling 17,000 miles around the globe to tromp around in a mess of snow in our summer sandals wasn't such a great idea, we did it anyway. We also went to the famous Tralee Station, where we learned to throw a boomerang and actually have it return -- and learned a new meaning for the familiar Ralph Nader term, "unsafe at any speed."

With most of our fingers and toes still intact, we moved back to Sydney for the last leg of our Aussie adventure. We spent one pleasant day riding the Sydney Explorer, special buses that continuously circle the city, stopping at each of the 17 tourist attractions on the route. For a one-time \$5 fee, a tourist can hop on and off at any stop, any time, for an entire day. We stayed in King's Cross, the "42nd Street" of Sydney, where if you've got the money, honey, you can rent or buy anything that crosses your mind -- or your path -- there.

We enjoyed today's Australians, in general still much like Americans, but singularly independent and not much in awe of anything or anyone. Australians

by nature take very few things seriously, but among the few are their beer, boating, betting, footer and the weekend. The White Collar crowd close their shutters on Friday afternoon, while some -but by no means all -- storekeepers somewhat grudgingly open up for the 9-to-noon Saturday trade. By 11:50, there's a burly bruiser at the entrance to every shop, turning away latecomers and snarling at the persistent (and uninformed) who dare to storm his fort.







SOWP - What is it?

Perhaps, while reading items in "The MART" you have noted the ad usually headed: The SOCIETY OF WIRELESS PIONEERS? You may have wondered if you were eligible, since you remember handling some paid, commercial radiograms while you served in the military as a radio operator.

Immediately following World War II before RCA, Globe, Mackay and other commercial radio services could get back into action — U.S. Navy stations handled a great deal of the paid-commercial radio traffic about the world. In a like manner, such traffic was handled by foreign countries and from one day to the next, while sailing around the globe, new services were being pressed into action on a temporary basis.

The writer of this column has been an active radio officer for many years. All during the war, on troop transports and as the war terminated, the troop ships often returned to carrying passengers, — long before the radio stations around the world were back in business. It became a


daily game, at such time, to listen for all possible outlets for our traffic. Every opportunity was taken to let shore stations of all descriptions know we were again a passenger vessel, in case they picked up anything for us.

What I'm trying to emphasize is: If you were a radio opeator at some such facility handling paid-commercial traffic by radio to ships or between such stations, you might be eligible to become a life member of SOWP. Think back over your career as a brass-pounder and if such proud shoe fits, write to SOWP, Box 530, Santa Rosa, CA 95402. Give our "Bill" the full details and tell him SOWP Life Member, SGP-139 "sent you." If you visit a radio club, look around you; likely there are SOWP members present. Members who served prior to 1915 are classified as (S-SGP) Senior Spark Gap Pioneers. (SGP) served from 1915 to 1925; (P) Pioneers from 1926 to 1939; (V) means Veterans having served from 1940 to 1949 and (M) are Regular Members, covering the year 1950 to present date.


